A LIST OF THE DESCENDANTS OF JACOB C. WIREBACH (4) BORN 1808 DIED 1877

The first ancestor of Jacob C. Wlrebach (4) of which we can find any record was

JOHN NICHOLAS WIREBACH (1)

who was born in County Hesse, Germany about the year 1710. About the year 1752, when he was 42 years of age_, he left Rotterdam, Holland, with his wife Chrisanne and his 21 year old son, Isaac, and arrived at the Port of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The family settled in the County of Bucks where they operated a farm.

ISAAC WIREBACH (2)

the son of John Nicholas Wlrebach (1) was born in Germany, April 10, 1730 and died in Springfield Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, March 11, 1805. Isaac married Anna Frey and the couple purchased a farm from Cornelius Raisley, who received a grant from William Penn. David H. Miller (7) an Easton Attorney, has in his possession a copy of the will of Isaac Wirebach (2) which was probated April 3, 1805, and recorded in Will Book No.7, page 110, Register of Wills Office of Bucks County, Pennsylvania. This will refers to Isaac as a yeoman owning a plantation and bequeathing monetary legacies in pounds and shillings, and that his wife's name was Anna. Some of the descendants now living remember an old family story that Isaac was not too popular with his neighbors because he kept a number of slaves. The will gives the names of the following children: Henry Wirebach (3) - Peter Wirebach (3) - Jacob Wirebach (3) - Isaac Wirebach (3) Elizabeth Wirebach (3) - (later intermarried with Michael Smell) and Margaret Wirebach (3) (later intermarried with Henry Herpst).

JACOB WIREBACH (3)

was the son of Isaac Wirebach (2) who was born in Springfield Township and died in 1856. He was a kind and benevolent man and a member of the German Reformed Church. He was married three times, first to Mary Ackerman by which they had one child. The second marriage was to Elizabeth Eughmy, by which they had six children. The third marriage was to Margaret Wolslayer, by which they had ten children, a total of seventeen children. The following are the names of the children:

It is supposed that Jacob C. Wirebach was the son of Margaret Wolslayer Wirebach.

JACOB C. WIREBACH (4)

Jacob C. Wirebach (4) was born in Bucks County, Pennsylvania on June 8,1808 and died in Easton, Pennsylvania, May 3, 1877. He married Catherine Short a daughter of George and Salome Romfield Short. (The name was Choate or Shoatt, and later became Short). The story is told of Salome Romfield being an attractive and active girl who eloped with George Short to Easton, using her father's horse "Star". They were married in the First Reformed Church on North Third Street. Her father, who was in the Court House, which was then located in Center Square, looking out of the window said "If I did not know that my horse, "Star" was at home in the barn I'd swear that he was drawing that carriage up Third Street". He was right, it was his daughter Salome, and George Short. George Short was a native of Virginia, and later moved to Montgomery County, where their daughter Catherine Short was born May 3, 1807, and died in Easton, Pennsylvania October 8, 1879. Jacob C. Wirebach was a member of the German Reformed Church that used the church that is now in Hayes Cemetery. When the St. Peters Reformed Church was chartered November 15, 1862 he was appointed on the first Board of Deacons. It was in the year 1835 that he and his family of three children settled on a farm on Morgan's Hill South of Easton. In 1837 he purchased about 100 acres of land from the Lehigh Coal and Navigation Company at a cost of 10,000 dollars. This included that part of South Side, Easton

that lies West of Coal Street, East of McKeen Street and North of Line Street. This he cut up into building lots and sold then on easy terms. Many of the men working in the shops of the Lehigh Valley Railroad were able to purchase these lots and build their own homes. Many of the descendants of these men are still living

in some of these homes. He was a man of honor and integrity and his motto was taken from Prov. 30; 8, Give me neither poverty or riches. At his death he left each of his children a home on a good sized plot of ground and a number of smaller homes. There were nine children born to Catherine and Jacob C. Wirebach.

MANASSES S. WIREBACH (5)

was the first child of Jacob C. Wirebach (4), born in Bucks County on October 14, 1828 and died in Easton, Nay 18, 1851. He married but his wife's name is not known. She died in 1851.

SALOME WIREBACH (5)

was the second child of Jacob C ., Wirebach (4), being born October 30, 18,1830 and died in Easton, January 6, 1905. She married Aaron Transue, an attorney, who was born December 31, 1831 and died in Easton, October 21, 1904. Their home was at 412 Centre Street, Easton, Pa. When Gov. Curtin called for the Militia in an emergency in September 1862, he *left* with 100 others from the community. This couple had no children, but adopted Salome's brother's daughter, Mary M. Wirebach (6) who was born February 28, 1857 and died November 12,1861. (no other children)

URBANUS SHORT WIREBACH (5)

was the third child of Jacob C. Wirebach (4), being born in Bucks County, May 25, 1833 and died in Easton, April 30, 1916. He married Lena Berry, July 19,1853, daughter of John and Elizabeth Berry, who was born 1838 and died in Easton, September 15, 1905. She was a paralytic for a period of 13 years, but always cheerful and she had a great religious faith. She was a member of the Metho dist Church. Her grandfather, George Berry, came to America as an officer in the British Army. Her sisters were Anna, Elizabeth, Martha and Emma Berry. Urbanus was a farmer and later became a supervisor in South Easton. He served in the Civil War with Company C, First Penn. Volunteers, under Capt. Jack Armstrong and was discharged with the rank of Sergeant. Eight children were born to this couple:

KATHERINE ELIZABETH WIREBACH (6)

was the oldest child of Urbanus Wirebach (5) being born in Easton, March 6,1854 and died in Easton, January 26, 1924. She was confirmed in the First Reformed Church of Easton, and for a number of years taught school in South Easton. After her sister, Mary (6), who was adopted by Aaron Transue, died she made her home with the Transues. On July 17, 1878, she married John Augustus Waltman, son of Joseph and Mary Bast Waltman who was born May 25, 1851 and died in Easton, November 6, 1909. (This John A. Waltman is not to be confused with his nephew John F. Waltman who married her sister Daisy). Three sons were born to this couple:

RAYMOND IRVIN WALTMAN (7) was born in Easton, January 29,1880 and died in Allentown, April 25, 1946. He married Nellie Grace Clark, daughter of John and Aurora Hahn Clark. Margaret Isabella Wirebach was the third child of nine children of Jacob C. and Catherine Wirebach. Born October 2, 1835 and died at Ebensburg, Pa., December 11, 1912. She married John Guiley III whose grandfather was one of the Hessions captured by Washington, December 26, 1776, at Trenton, N. J. His father, John Gulley II. was born at Reading, Pa. in 1787, and married Mary C. Clinger. John Guiley III was born at Reading, Pa., February 24, 1826, and died at Allentown, Pa., June 17, 1896. He moved to South Easton in the year 1852 and conducted a Drug Store at that place. Five children were born to this couple.

Harper Augustus Regual Guiley (6) was born in Easton, May 6, 1855. He graduated from the South Easton High School in 1872, and Jefferson Medical College in 1877, capturing the J. M.
